



# INTERNAL REGULATIONS CAMPING LE MARTINET

## 1°- ADMISSION CONDITIONS

To be admitted to the campsite, you must be authorised by the manager or his representative. The manager is obliged to ensure that the campsite is kept in good order and that the present internal regulations are applied. The fact of staying on the campsite implies acceptance of the provisions of these rules and the commitment to comply with them.

## 2° - POLICE FORMALITIES

Any person who is to stay at least one night on the campsite must first show the manager or his representative an identity document and complete the formalities required by the police.

Minors who are not accompanied by their parents will only be admitted with a written authorisation from their parents and with the agreement of the campsite managers.

## 3°- INSTALLATION

The tent or caravan and the related equipment must be installed on the site indicated in accordance with the instructions given by the manager or his representative.

## 4°- RECEPTION OFFICE

The reception office is open from : 9.00 am to 12 and 2.30 pm to 7 pm from 1 July to 31 August. Outside these dates, the reception office is open from 9.30am to 12pm and from 3.30pm to 7pm.

At the reception desk you will find all the information about the services of the campsite, information about food and drink, sports facilities, tourist attractions in the area and various addresses that may be useful.

## 5° - FEES

Fees are paid at the reception desk. Their amount is displayed at the entrance to the campsite and at the reception desk. They are due according to the number of nights spent on the site.

Any customer need to pay their balance 30 days before arrival, according to general conditions of sales, and latest when arrived at the Campsite.

Campers are requested to inform the reception office of their departure the day before.

## 6° - NOISE AND SILENCE

The users of the campsite are urged to avoid all noise and discussions that could disturb their neighbours.

Sound equipment must be adjusted accordingly. Car doors and trunks must be closed as quietly as possible.

Dogs and other animals should never be left unattended. They must not be left on the campsite, even locked up, in the absence of their owners who are civilly responsible for them.

There must be complete silence between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.

## 7° - VISITORS

After having been authorised by the manager or his representative, visitors may be admitted to the campsite under the responsibility of the campers who receive them.

The camper may receive one or more visitors at the reception. If these visitors are allowed to enter the campsite, the camper who receives them may be required to pay a fee, insofar as the visitor has access to the services and/or facilities of the campsite. This fee shall be displayed at the entrance to the campsite and at the reception desk.

If the visitor stays on the campsite, he/she must pay the applicable fee and the number of persons on the pitch or in the accommodation must not exceed the maximum capacity. If the maximum capacity is exceeded, the visitor who wishes to stay on the campsite must take an additional pitch.

Visitors' cars are not allowed on the campsite.

## 8° - TRAFFIC AND PARKING OF VEHICLES

Inside the campsite, vehicles must drive at a speed limit of 20 km/h. Traffic is forbidden between 11 pm and 6 am.

Only vehicles belonging to campers staying on the campsite may circulate within the campsite. The strictly forbidden parking on the pitches usually occupied by the camping shelters must not, moreover, hinder traffic or prevent the installation of new arrivals.

## 9°- DEAD GARAGE

The establishment does not allow the use of a "dead garage".

## 10° - GAMES

No violent or disturbing games may be organised near the facilities.

The meeting room may not be used for lively games.

Children must always be under the supervision of their parents.

## 11° - POSTING

The present rules and regulations are displayed at the entrance to the campsite and at the reception desk. It is given to the client on request.

# REGLEMENT INTERIEUR

## 12° - BEHAVIOUR AND APPEARANCE OF THE INSTALLATIONS

Everyone is required to refrain from any action that could harm the cleanliness, hygiene and appearance of the campsite.

It is forbidden to throw polluted water on the ground or in the gutters.

Caravanners must empty their waste water into the facilities provided for this purpose. Household refuse, waste of any kind, papers, must be deposited in the bins.

Everyone is required to refrain from any action that could harm the cleanliness, hygiene and appearance of the campsite and its facilities, especially sanitary facilities.

Washing is strictly forbidden outside the bins provided for this purpose.

Hanging out is tolerated until 10 a.m. near the shelters, provided that it is very discreet and does not disturb the neighbours. It should never be done from trees.

Plantations and floral decorations must be respected. It is forbidden to put nails in the trees, to cut branches, to make plantations.

It is also not permitted to mark out the location of an installation by personal means, nor to dig up the ground.

Any damage to the vegetation, fences, grounds or facilities of the campsite will be charged to the person responsible.

The pitch used during the stay must be maintained in the same condition as the camper found it on arrival. Similarly for the rental accommodation, the client is obliged to return the accommodation in the state in which he found it. If additional cleaning material is required, the client can contact the reception desk.

## 13° - SAFETY

### • Fire

1. Covered fires (wood, coal, etc.) are strictly forbidden. Stoves must be kept in good working order and not be used in dangerous conditions.

In case of fire, the management must be notified immediately. Fire extinguishers can be used if necessary. A first aid kit is available at the reception desk.

1. Flooding

2. Although unlikely, rapid flooding of part of the campsite could occur in the event of very heavy rainfall and require evacuation. Campers will be notified by loudspeaker of the rising water and the order to evacuate. Please remain calm and follow the instructions carefully.

The evacuation concerns people first, leave your vehicle and camping equipment on site. Consult the evacuation plan at the reception desk and on the toilet blocks. This plan only concerns people, find out in advance your escape route to the regrouping area.

### • Theft

The management is responsible for the objects left at the office and has a general obligation to monitor the campsite. The camper remains responsible for his or her own facilities and must report any suspicious persons to the manager. Although the campsite is guarded, the users of the campsite are invited to take the usual precautions for the safeguard of their equipment.

## 14° - PETS

Pets are welcome in the campsite and in some rental accommodations (dogs category 1 and 2 forbidden) (with caution). They must be kept on leash and walked outside the campsite. Owners are responsible to clean up after them and to respect common hygiene. Price 3 € per animal (maxi 1) and per day.

Pets are not allowed in our accommodation (chalets, cabins and lodges).

## 15° - INFRINGEMENT OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE

In the event that a resident disturbs the stay of other users or does not respect the provisions of these rules and regulations, the manager or his representative may orally or in writing if he deems it necessary, give notice to the latter to cease the disturbance.

In the event of serious or repeated infringement of the internal regulations and after formal notice from the manager to comply with them, the latter may terminate the contract.

In the event of a criminal offence, the manager may call in the police.

## 16° - SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Double axle caravans are not allowed on the campsite.

**Restaurant guests, if they are not campsite users, are requested to leave their vehicles outside the campsite.**

- in the blue bin: plastic bottles and flasks, cardboard packaging, newspapers, magazines, leaflets, tins, drinks cans, aerosols, food bricks, objects and plastic bags.

- In the grey bin: greasy paper, leftover food, polystyrene packaging and trays, non-empty packaging.

- In the compost bin: food scraps without artificial materials (peelings, vegetable scraps, egg shells, etc.)
